Jose Regin F. Regidor obtained his B.S. and M.S. in Civil Engineering from the University of the Philippines Diliman in 1993 and 1995. He joined the Department of Civil Engineering that same year as an Assistant Professor. He obtained a Doctor of Engineering degree in 1999 from the Yokohama National University and is currently Associate Professor at the Institute of Civil Engineering (ICE). He is the present Director of the National Center for Transportation Studies (NCTS) and concurrently heads the Transportation Engineering Group of the UP-ICE.

Dr. Regidor is currently engaged in research on environmentally sustainable transport and road traffic safety. He is also active in promoting the advocacies of NCTS and UP through the extension of technical assistance primarily to government agencies. These include collaborations with the Department of Transportation and Communications, the Department of Public Works and Highways, and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources. In such cases, he has served as member of various technical working committees. He is the study team leader for the "Formulation of a National Environmentally Sustainable Transport Strategy for the Philippines," where the NCTS was designated as the national collaborating center working with the national focal agencies, the DOTC and the DENR.
